THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

Glory to the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Deut. 4:32-34, 39-40, Rom. 8:14-17, Matthew 28:16-20

The disciples saw Jesus, and worshipped Him, but still doubted. Without doubt, faith wouldn't be necessary. Thus, faith as a virtue is overcoming doubts about divine mysteries, even when they defy human logic. As the disciples were still trying to grasp the mystery of resurrection, Jesus commissioned them through the mystery of the Trinity, to baptize in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

Before the incarnation, Moses told the Israelites, "The LORD is God in the heavens above and on earth below, and there is no other." "God spoke in the midst of fire and his voice was heard by the people." The Same Word of God that was heard amid fire, through a Virgin and by the overshadowing of the Holy Spirit, took flesh and became man - Christ. In the beginning, according to the Gospel of John, ... the Word was with God and the Word was God...." God is Spirit, no limitations, no barriers. Indeed, the profound mystery of the Trinity is anchored on the Scripture yet challenging to comprehend by the best of scripture scholars. "Let us create man in our 'own' image." The plural reference hints at the Trinity, with Christ existing before His incarnation – "before Abraham I was" - and the Spirit hovering over the chaotic void.

We have one God, who through grace, has made us His children in Christ Jesus regardless of culture, religion, or race. Paul reveals that "Those whom the Spirit of God leads are children of God." God is God and nothing is impossible for him. He relates to us as we have come to understand through faith as a Father who generates, as a Son who redeems, and as a Spirit through whom we have life. His essence is never increased or diminished in the individuality of His personhood as Father, Son or Spirit or in the unity of the three Persons as one God.

In the doctrine of the Trinity, where reason ends, faith kicks in. Let us, therefore, keep our eyes on the one true God who is kind, merciful, and compassionate. Let us adore the Trinity of eternal glory – Father, Son and Spirit in what is proper to each Person, their unity in substance, their equality in majesty, One God in Three Persons.
