The Man of Faith is like a Farmer

Ezekiel 17:22-24, 2 Corinthians 5:6-10, Mark 4:26-34

As children, we are curious and full of questions. As adults, we often reconcile ourselves to living with many unanswered questions, which can be challenging because humans naturally seek to understand why things are the way they are.

In the First Reading, Ezekiel speaks God's encouraging words: "I, the LORD, bring low the high tree, lift high the lowly tree, wither up the green tree, and make the withered tree bloom." This raises a poignant question: If God is this powerful as Ezekiel's prophecy suggests, why do we still suffer and face challenges despite our efforts to follow His commandments? Is there a purpose behind our difficulties and struggles?

St. Paul in the Second Reading urges us to be courageous and maintain hope, no matter the circumstances. He reminds us that we walk by faith, not by sight, and assures us that God will reward our efforts even if we do not see immediate results. Faith is crucial in our journey. God is with us every step of the way.

Jesus reinforces these messages through two parables. He illustrates that just as a farmer does not fully understand how a seed grows, we cannot fully comprehend the ways of God. The growth of God's kingdom, like natural growth, is mysterious. Our role is to remain positive and faithful, trusting that God will not forsake His people.

The farmer sows the seed and waits for the harvest, unaware of the invisible processes at work. Similarly, so much in our lives are beyond our understanding. The man of faith is like a farmer - positive and courageous. God is at work! The second parable teaches us that even the smallest faith can lead to great outcomes. God works through situations that seem unpromising. Our efforts, though they may seem insignificant, but it can produce abundant results with God's help.

Sylvia Plath once said, "The worst enemy of creativity is self-doubt." Believe that with God, you can achieve your goals. It might take time, as a mustard seed grows into a large tree, but patience and persistence will lead to fulfillment. We walk by faith, not just by sight. Be filled with the Holy Spirit and may God help us remain strong and courageous despite the ups and downs in life. Amen.
