The Prophetic Ministry and Rejection.

Ezekiel 2:2-5, Psalm 123:1-4, 2 Corinthians 12:7-10, Mark 6:1-6 In the first reading, God tells Ezekiel, "Hard of face and obstinate of heart are they to whom I am sending you. But you shall say to them: Thus says the LORD GOD! And whether they heed or resist—for they are a rebellious house—they shall know that a prophet has been among them.

"Through baptism, we receive a prophetic ministry that we carry out in various forms as parents, teachers, counselors, and guardians. We proclaim the word of God, instruct, and teach. But one might ask, what is the point of our prophetic mission if our message will likely be rejected? Will it not be an effort in futility to announce God's will when it seems certain that people will not listen to us?

The first reading from Ezekiel highlights the importance of the prophetic mission: 'to bear witness.' The prophet's role is not about personal victory or proof of self-righteousness. A true prophet operates with internal freedom, not seeking popular consensus or a friendly welcome. The prophet's task is to deliver God's message faithfully.

Our duty as God's prophets is faithfulness to His word in our mission to guide, instruct, and teach. God's instruction to Ezekiel applies to all: 'Proclaim the values of the Gospel.' These values are integral to the founding principles of our nation. Having celebrated 248 years of American independence, it is fitting to remember that this nation was built on the belief in the sacredness of life of every person, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness. Anything contrary is from the enemy who plants at night.

Times change but values last. We Christians have to stand up for the values and principles we hold dear. Prophets may or may not be answer. We need to speak the truth. We need to keep the faith. Our prophetic duty obliges us to proclaim these truths consistently with charity, always bearing in mind that it is God who initiates conversion in a person. He is the one who makes fruitful the good seeds we sow as ministers of his words.

Do not let rejection discourage us from our obligations. Jesus and Ezekiel experienced the rejection many of us face when proclaiming the oracle of God. In Jesus' case, the rejection was from people who knew him too well. They questioned His authority, just like we question the authority of brethren looking out for our good. "Who are you to tell me what to do?" We take offense the way some people took offense at Jesus.

Paul acknowledges his weaknesses and finds strength and wisdom in admitting them. The Psalmist encourages us to approach God like Paul, relying on His grace in our weaknesses. Let us appreciate the voice of God speaking to us through those who bring the values of His kingdom to our attention. We build happy families and better societies by appreciating constructive criticism, accepting encouragement, and being open to good advice. Peace and grace through Christ our Lord, Amen.
