The Binary of Selfishness and Selflessness *Jer. 23:1-6, Psalm 23:1-6, Eph. 2:13-18, Mark 6:30-34*

"My sheep hear my voice," says the Lord; "I know them, and they follow me."

A child once told me her grandma was a saint because she was always compassionate and had time for everyone. Indeed, a saintly quality is to have time and compassion for all, much like Jesus, as portrayed in today's Gospel reading. Even when He needed rest, Jesus made time for everyone. As Paul puts it, Christ came for those who were far off and those who were near, he is for all, and through his selfless sacrifice, both those who are far and near have access in one Spirit to the Father.

The Gospel reading highlights the importance of rest. After the Apostles returned from their mission, Jesus recognized their need for rest. Despite this need for personal rest and time alone with his apostles, he compassionately tends to the crowds. This unselfish thoughtfulness is a lesson for us all. Parents, in particular, can relate to this selflessness, often putting their children's needs above their own.

The binary principle suggests two types of people: the self-ish and the selfless. Selfish people focus only on themselves, while selfless people, often seen as naive, prioritize the needs of others. Jesus lived a selfless life, and we are called to do the same as leaders and shepherds of God's children. This week, let us reflect: Am I a selfish or a selfless person?

In the First Reading, God, through Jeremiah, reprimands those who allow His flock to be destroyed and scattered. The message is for leaders and individuals in families, churches, and the society who neglect caring for others, seeking only their own comfort. However, God also promises to send a shepherd who will care for His flock—Christ, the Good Shepherd, who tends to His flock even at His own expense. An example we saw in Ezekiel and Amos in the last two Sundays.,

The willingness to forgo personal comfort to care for others demonstrates the heart of a true shepherd. This is the mark of good leaders—bishops, priests, parents, teachers, nurses, doctors, the police, those in the military and other profession of life. To love, care, and be compassionate is to be a true Christian.

Amidst the pressures of daily life, let us not lose sight of those who depend on our care and affection. By embodying compassion, thoughtfulness, and selflessness, we follow Jesus' example as good shepherds. Be Christ-like in your profession, and God will reward and bless you abundantly. Amen.
