Grace Shared is Grace Multiplied.

2 Kings 4:42-44, Psalm 145:10-18, Eph. 4:1-6, John 6:1-15

Andrew, said to Jesus, "There is a boy here who has five

barley loaves and two fish."

Elisha said, "Give it to the people to eat."

In today's readings, we see God's providential care through miraculous feedings. Elisha's miracle happened at the end of a long drought, where a man's kindness enabled the prophet to feed his hungry community. In the Gospel, a little boy's generosity allowed Jesus to perform the miracle of multiplying the loaves and fish. God uses human beings and their resources to meet our basic needs—food, clothing, and shelter. Mahatma Gandhi once said, "To the poor man, God does not appear except in the form of bread and the promise of work." Bread and work are products and acts of man who is blessed by God. Give from the blessings received, for grace shared is grace multiplied.

The central message is that nothing we have is too little to help those in need. Mother Teresa of Calcutta said, "Never worry about numbers. Help one person at a time, and always start with the person nearest to you." Elisha's servant and Jesus' disciples worried about the numbers, wondering how they could feed so many with so little. Yet Elisha and Jesus simply distributed what was available, trusting in God's abundance. Always begin with what you have, and God will grant the increase. Don't hide your resources thinking they are too little; they are enough for God to work miracles. Even the fragments matter. Jesus instructed, "Gather up the fragments so that nothing gets wasted."

As Christians, especially as Catholics, we thank God for the blessing and gift of the Eucharist because ordinary bread and wine is what Christ offers us through transubstantiation as His true body and blood. This bread and wine in the visible eyes becomes Christ' body and blood for a spiritual feast so that we may have life and have it in abundance. The way the Lord works in the Eucharist is how he works in our lives. He takes the little and the ordinary we offer to him and utilizing them, he accomplishes things beyond our imaginations.

After feeding the multitude, the people wanted to make Jesus king, but He withdrew to the mountain. Jesus wants us to seek God not just for miracles, but for His own sake. In providing aid, let it not be for vain glory. Let the glory of God and the well-being of others be our motive as we give. God, who sees and knows every heart, will reward you abundantly through Christ our Lord. Amen.
